Presentation Type Information

We welcome you to consider the following presentation and format options.

- 30- or 45minute Standard Lecture
- 30- or 45-minute Panel Session

A panel session will involve a formal discussion between 2-5 presenters of relevant ideas and topics.

- 30- or 45-minute Debate
 - A debate will involve presentations discussing opposing views on a selected topic. After each presenter has presented, they will discuss the advantages and disadvantages of each view, and conclude the session with a summary.
- Interactive Poster Presentation
 - Poster board size is 4'x8' (1.2x2.4m) and all materials must fit within this space.

Oral Presentations require a minimum of 25% of the presentation time for discussion and interaction with the audience.
